Sparkel has asked me to be her sole visitor on Christmas Day.

I can't wait to hug my little sissy and try my hardest to rescue her from the storm. But I know she ultimately has to want to help herself.

Please say a prayer for her if you can, even if it just a quick supper prayer in your personal thoughts.


